Pompey takes Jerusalem and Temple in late 64 B.C.; consult Ussher, Annals. The counsels were Cicero and Antonius, but this was before the Julian Calendar Reform, so that they were elected in the late summer of 64 b.c. and entered office in the fall. Josephus counts 27 years before Antigonus is put to death, (64 B.C. - 38 B.C.)

Josephus puts the conquest of Jerusalem by Sosius in a sabbatical year, and has it still going on after the conquest. The city fell in the third month, in the month of Sivan, on a fast day. Josephus dates this event using the Roman Counselate as 37 b.c.e., but he is contradicted by Dio Cassius who places the event in 38 b.c.e. Dio's dating was the preferred dating. This is confirmed by the fact that Herod's seventh year fell in 31 b.c.e. at the same time as the battle of Actium (Sept. 2, 31 b.c.e), before Tishri 1 (A.J. 15.121). If Herod's first year was 37/36, then his 7th would be 31/30, which would start after Tishri 31, meaning that the battle of Actium was in his 6th year. One wonder's if Josephus rigged his sabbatical year notations (which would agree with Zuckermann's system.) Seder Olam rigs world chronology to make 490 years fit between the destruction of the two temples, and Josephus says, "Now this oracle certainly denoted the government of Vespasian, who was appointed emperor in Judea (B.J. 6.5.4 [6.313])." Perhaps, we should attribute the Talmudic tradition that the destruction of both temples fell in a postsabbatical year to this misinterpretation of Daniel's prophecy, seeing Josephus knew about it.
