2. Flood Year Chronology

Between the 3rd edition and the 4th edition the flood year was changed from 2484 to 2483. This was made possible by refinements in the program for calculating new moons used in this book, and the realization that Genesis does not say exactly whether the flood was at the beginning of Noah's 600th year or at the end of it. It was found that the adjustment could be made without contradicting any of the surrounding data, and without upsetting the sabbatical or jubilee structure. More details are contained in *The Resurrection Day Of Messiah Yeshua*. Part of the change is a spin off from the discovery that the words "at the end of" in Deut. 31:10 really mean "at the boundary of." This finds application in Gen. 8:3 such that it allows the 17th day of the 7th month to be the 150th day. This in turn allows 4, 30 day months, and 1 29 day month to make up the required months, in which 149 days plus one more day (the 17th of the 7th month) make up 150 days, according to the rule of inclusive counting.

It is not impossible that 2484 BC was the flood year, as formerly preferred in this book. All it requires is the assumption that the moon's motion experienced some slight catastrophe during the flood or soon after it. Walt Brown's book, *In the Beginning*, 8th edition, contains some suggestions of likely catastrophes and possible physics.

(Perhaps the Sumerian/Babylonian base 60 numbering system was related to the pre-flood year.)
