Due to the failing of the genetic viability of direct heirs of Amenemhet III's successors, the kingship passed to more distant relatives. In order to prevent wars of succession, they were appointed in turn to the kingship by Joseph who held sufficient power and respect to arbitrate. For the remainder of his life, all contenders were allowed to rotate into the kingship.

Shamshi-Adad I conquers Assyria, takes Asshur. He is the first Amorite king to rule Assyria.

The Essarhaddon distanzengaben inscription between Erishum I and Shamshi Adad I is 126 years, but the Shamshi Adad inscription gives 159 years. The difference is the added 33 year reign of Shamshi Adad himself. When the reign of Erishum I is also added, the total is 199 years from year 1 of Erishum I to the final year of Shamshi Adad I.

Rim-sin seized Isin; 31 years later Hammurabi took Isin.

Death of Shamshi-Adad I

Hammurabi synchronized 17th year to death of Shamshi-Adad I, agrees with MEC eclipse and Venus inscription 1638.

The 14th dynasty never controlled more than the region of Xoïs in the western delta. Many of its kings bear distinctly Canaanite names, suggesting, that like the 15th dynasty, they were derived from immigrants that came to Egypt during the great famine. There are many uncertainties about this dynasty, but we should not let this bother us, and I have not listed its kings in this edition.

The north-west-delta revolts against the 13th and sets up its own dynasty in Xoïs, the 14th, which lasts until 1645 BC, although it was reduced to vassals by the 15th dynasty.
