The Roman new year was Jan 1, AD 15. Now Suetonius states that Tiberius died "in the seventy-eighth year of his age and the twenty-third of his reign, on the seventeenth day before the Kalends of April, in the consulship of Gnaeus Acerronius Proculus and Gaius Pontius Nigrinus." This proves that the first year of his reign is counted after the turn of the new year for three cultures, Roman, Greek, and Jewish. The method used is the normal accession year method.
