The Sunday Letter from Heaven: His writings are the first to report on the letter from heaven forged in the name of Messiah that all Christians should observe Sunday in a manner like the seventh day Sabbath. This letter went through several versions, many languages, and appeared in many places, being promoted in the cause of Sunday observance. The fraud lasted for centuries even though it was detected and condemned by authorities. It was readily believed by the people and the lower ranking priests. The classic version is that the letter fell from heaven and landed on an altar where it was discovered. The requirements of the letter are consistent with Sunday Sabbatarianism in Visigothic Spain, and earlier writers.

Augustine of Canterbury: sent by Pope Gregory to "convert" the Celts, who however, were already Christians and refused to submit to Papal enslavement. The Celts used a Latin Bible unlike the Vulgate, and kept Saturday as a day of rest, with special religious services on Sunday. A.C. Flick, *The Rise of the Mediaeval Church*

The Pope claims the Antichrist will cause the Sabbath to be kept free from work as well as Sunday when he comes. He acknowledges the existence of Sabbath observers, and does not seem to have the ability to persecute anyone except with words.

Isidore of Seville writes *De fide catholica contra Iudaeos*. He argued with Jews that God himself must work on the Sabbath since he is active every day. For the Visigothic kings, who had recently become Catholic, were trying to make the Jews into Christians by persecution. Since God was active on the Sabbath, he concluded that Sabbath observance must be purely spiritual. But this contradicts Exodus 31:17 and also a proper concept of the Almighty.

AD 614 After a 21 day siege Persia takes Jerusalem from the Byzantines. The Sassanids kill tens of thousands of Christians in the city.
